

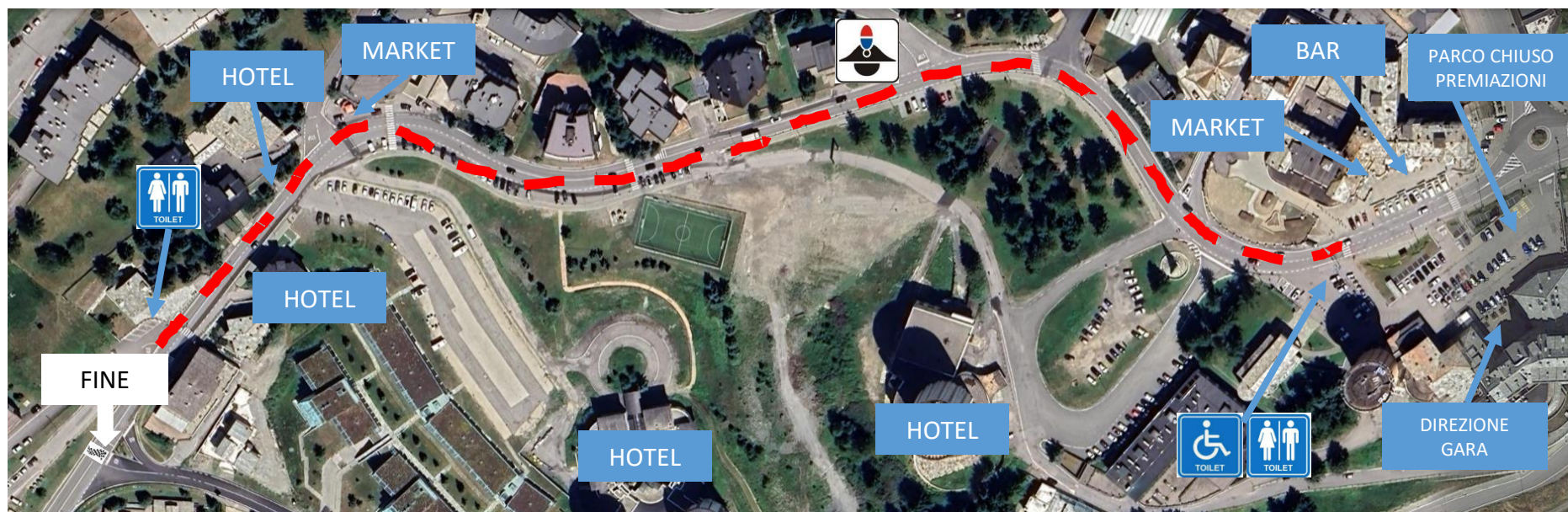

SESTRIERE

Sestriere (IPA: /ses'trjere/; Ēl Sestrier in piemontese, Sestrieras or La Sestriera in Occitan, Sestrières in French) is an Italian municipality of 917 inhabitants in the metropolitan city of Turin, in Piedmont.

With its 2035 m above sea level it is the highest municipality in Italy, referring the altitude to the height above sea level of the town hall.

It is located on the hill of the same name that connects the Val Chisone and the Valle di Susa, dominated to the northwest by Mount Fraiteve (2701 m) to the southeast by Mount Sises (2658 m), by Punta Rognosa di Sestriere (3280 m) and by Mount Motta (2850 m).

The residential areas are Sestriere Colle, on the watershed line, Sestriere Borgata, in the Chisone valley, Champlas du Col and Champlas Janvier, in the Susa valley.
